Staff members are often faced with great challenges when working to be able to continue to maintain the high standard of service but with far fewer resources. For this, you have our greatest appreciation.

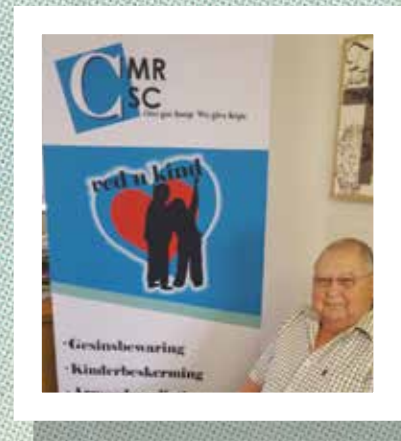
In recent years, much attention has been given to strategic planning and staff utilisation.

The Preservation of Families is the first of three Programmes of Hope that forms part of the CMR North's service offering. The programme aims to ensure, through different interventions, that families are supported to deal with the challenges of the world.

The Family Preservation Programme includes the following:

- Group work with children
- Parental guidance and therapeutic groups with parents
- Marriage counseling
- Divorce coaching
- Life skills
- Trauma counselling
- Prevention and treatment of substance abuse

CHILD PROTECTION CENTRE (CPC):

Our newest Center of HOPE!

In April 2015, the CPC was established with five social workers who mainly support the Gauteng offices and assists with children's court investigations that could lead to the protection of children. This process is in line with the Child Law and is a formal legal process. In the last year, these workers have managed 300 cases where 345 children were involved.

CMR NORTH CHILDREN CENTRE:

The CMR North Children's Centre has also gone through an exciting time. After more than a decade, the facility has moved from Wessels Street in downtown Pretoria to the Louis Botha Children's Home in Queenswood. The center has rendered the following services:

- Assessment and reach therapeutic services (568 children reached)
- Foster Care Inspection Services (106 completed foster care inspections)
- Adoption Services (1 306 people reached)
- Support of teenage pregnancies (Berg en Dal) (14 teens receiving services)
- Placement of 55 babies into adoptive care

Foster child placed by CMR North

A family is reported to the Child Protection Center. Two daughters of 15 and 16 respectively, and their brother of 5. The 15-year-old was diagnosed with cancer. The children's mother suffers from severe depression and couldn't care for them at all. Grandma had to step in, but she was already in her late 70's and had health concerns.

With the first court appearance it was found that these children are actually in desperate need of care and they were placed at place of safety. For the little brother of 5 years it was quite a traumatic experience, because a very strong bond had formed between him and his grandmother. He cried non-stop at the shelter. The CMR North appointed him a play therapist.

After about 6 weeks, the child's attitude started to change and he is now happy at the shelter. Although he still misses his grandmother, he gets to see her regularly and, with the help of the therapist, his coping skills have improved.

It's still early days, but we've already seen progress. The 15-year-old cancer patient can now focus on her treatment in a positive environment in order to get better.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND POVERTY RELIEF



Unemployment and inflation are on the rise and thus the poverty rate increases with it. The CMR North did experience in quite a palpable way in the past financial year that there are people whose Rands can't stretch far enough to afford basic necessities.

One geographical area that really struggled over the past few months is Rustenburg. This office alone has provided more than 700 people with food and other essentials as basic support.

CMR North aims to support families through a few initiatives.

- Sewing groups and other crafts
- Materialistic support through food and clothes packages (around 3 000 people reached)
- Awareness: Child Protection Week and The 16 Days of Activism for No Violence Against Women and Children Campaign (nearly 20 000 people reached)
- Participation in and management of Pre-school Development Programmes

We also care for the environment, not only for each other.

On 23 September 2015 CMR Pretoria West, in partnership with students from UP, the Department of Agriculture, and the Tshwane Municipality celebrated Arbor Day at two primary schools in Lotus Gardens. 900 children were part of the festivities and we put the spotlight on the importance of looking after the environment and nature.



SHE DIDN'T LOOK UP

Story from a social worker

She did not look up. Somewhere between the fine strands of hair falling down streaming down her cheeks, I thought I heard a "Morning". I also looked down and immediately saw the blue flip-flops and toenails. They were long and dirty and you could see that they were once painted red. Back when she could look up. Back when she wanted people to look at her.

I asked "What can I help you with?" An old habit of social workers. I notice her hopelessness and helplessness. Her frame reminds me of the frame of a twelve year old boy. Lean and no curves. A moment's quiet, then... "With everything". She looks up for the first time. Her beautiful blue eyes meet mine. That's when you know – there is something else that motivates you, something that drives you to help this woman to believe again. To perhaps make her laugh again.

You've heard her story before. But the incredible misery that is uttered pushes you to silently pray that you'll be able to make a difference. She lifts her skinny arm and shows how small her younger child was when the "welfare" came to take him away. "My husband damaged us. The children and

me. I have to see them, but don't know how to get to them."

"I clean the Indian man's house and do his laundry. Then I can eat." She speaks of the man as if I know him.

With sobs and hopeless gestures she explains where the children are. She once again lifts up her arm up to her hip and says: "Mam, he was this big."

Arrangements were made; home visits concluded, and when the day came to take her children home she was knocking on our office door bright and early. She was wearing her "finest".

She was silent, then she saw the waist-high boy – now almost as tall as she was. She muttered "my baby", opened her handbag and removed a packet of marshmallows. Then she did it: She fed her baby. And oddly enough, he allowed her.

That's when I realised that this woman was so traumatized that her world stopped the day her child was removed from her care. She still sees this boy as a waist-high toddler.

Intensive care and other services were offered and delivered. The waist-high child visited her. She blossomed. Borrowed a bowl from the neighbour to prepare some bread pudding. There's a potted plant on her kitchen table. The blue eyes now look up at you every so often.

And then, two days before Christmas, she arrived at the office. Bright orange pleated skirt, son by the hand and her laughing eyes meet mine. "I brought you a present. Open it. It's a kite." Because you showed me I can soar again."

I held the gift against my chest. A new habit of this social worker. And I knew, whatever kind of strain you take, that these moments make it all worth it.

That afternoon, I took my son outside and we let the simple, plastic kite soar high in the sky. And I thought to myself: "This is for you, mother whose child will always be waist-high in your eyes. Thank you for making me believe in what I do. Thank you for making me look up."

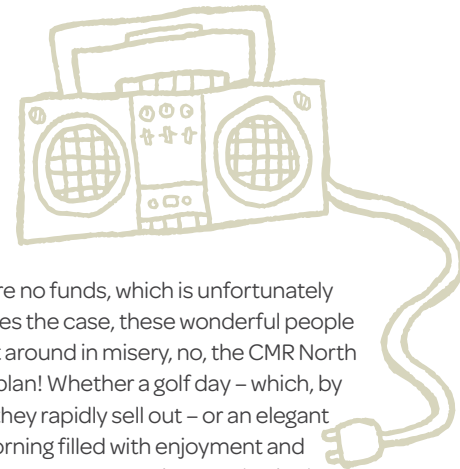


MESSAGE FROM OUR PATRONESS

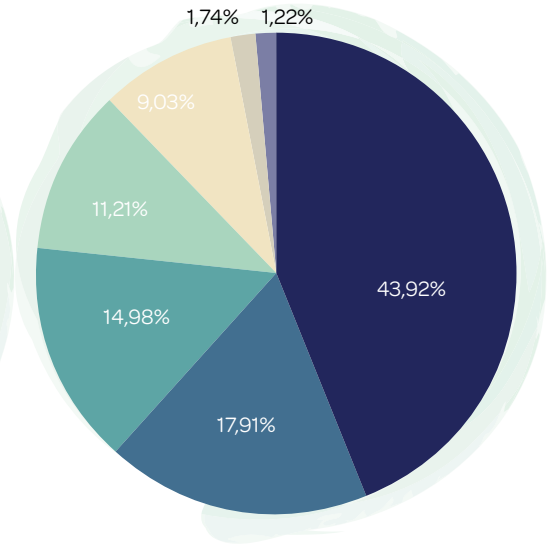
